Guam: 2012 Economic Census of Island Areas; U.S. Department of Commerce, U.S. Department of Commerce; April 2014. This economic census report provides detailed statistics on business establishments and serves as a useful measure in the development of the Gross Domestic Product. The report includes data on Guam's business establishments on employment size by industry, value of sales, annual payroll, operating expenses and amount of inventory.

This statistical report of Guam's business establishments by election district includes data by geographic area, sector, number of establishments, number of employees, annual payroll, sales receipts, and operating expenses. The report includes information about the federal granting agency, its programs, and amount awarded to each of the areas.

It presents air and sea arrival data and includes visitor profile and country of origin of passenger. Also includes occupancy taxes collected for the month.

MILITARY

Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement; Naval Facilities Engineering Command Pacific, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii for Joint Guam Program Office, Washington, DC; April 2014. This document is a supplement to the Department of the Navy's (DON) Record of Decision (ROD) signed September 20, 2010 regarding the 2010 Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Guam and Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Military Relocation; Relocating Marines from Okinawa, Visiting Aircraft Carrier Berthing, and Army Air and Missile defense Task Force (DON 2010). The draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) proposes to construct and operate a cantonment, including family housing, and a live-fire training range complex (LFTRC) on Guam that will support and accommodate a reduced and reconfigured number of marines

relocating to Guam. The proposed action also includes the provision of on-site utilities, access roads, and related off-site infrastructure to support the proposed cantonment/family housing and LFTRC. The Department of the Navy's preferred alternative is to build and operate the family housing at the Naval Base Guam, Telecommunications Site at Finegayan and the live-fire training range complex at Northwest Field on Andersen Air Force Base. The draft SEIS additionally contains appendices that include correspondences from elected officials and cooperating agencies, public notices, socioeconomic impact study, proposed action and alternatives and resource supporting documents.

Guam: United States Defense Deployments; Shirley A. Kan, Specialist in Asian Security Affairs, for Members and Committees of Congress; April 29, 2014. Since 2000, the U.S. military has been building up forward-deployed forces on the westernmost U.S. territory of Guam to increase U.S. presence, deterrence, and power projection for possible responses to crisis and disaster, counter terrorism, and contingencies in support of South Korea, Japan, the Philippines, Taiwan, or elsewhere in Asia. This report discusses the strategic significance of Guam for defense buildup, force relocations and deployments from the U.S. mainland, and U.S. force relocations from Japan to Guam. It addresses the Futenma Replacement Facility in Japan,

bilateral agreement between the U.S. government and the government of Japan concerning the implementation of the relocation of the marine forces from Okinawa to Guam, defense budgets for the marines' relocation and buildup on Guam, and concerns and issues for Congress.

Cancer in the U.S. Affiliated Pacific Islands, 2007-2011; Pacific Regional Central Cancer Registry, Cancer Council of the Pacific Islands, March 2014; March 2014. This report provides data on the prevalence and incidence of cancer in the U.S. affiliated Pacific Islands of American Samoa, Commonwealth of the Mariana Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau. The report defines cancer, prevention, staging, and cancer incidence and mortality rates. It provides summary information about major cancer sites and presents data on demographics, cancer cases, screening, and programs and services available by jurisdiction.

AGRICULTURE**FISHERIES**

Fishery Statistics of the Western Pacific: Volume 28, Territory of American Samoa (2011), Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (2011), Territory of Guam (2011), and the State of Hawaii (2011); Compiled by M. Kimberly Lowe, Michael Quach, Karen Brousseau and Ashley S. Tomita, National Marine Fisheries Service Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center and Joint Institute for Marine and Atmospheric Research; December 2013. This administrative report presents summaries of commercial landings for American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Guam and Hawaii. It provides scientific and technical information to marine resource managers, scientists, and the general public. The contents cover a range of topics including biological and economic research, stock assessment, and trends in fisheries. Data is collected by the Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center from each island and used to create the summaries and graphs found in this report. This document contains reports from each island on monthly and annual landings by fish species and species groups for the commercial fleet.

Marine Conservation Plan; Bureau of Statistics and Plans; 2014. This plan describes how the Governor of Guam proposes to allocate funds obtained under a Pacific Insular Areas Fishery Agreements (PIAFA) or collected from fisheries violations within the Guam Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) for the period of

2014-2017. The document provides information on the process which the Marine Conservation Plan was developed and reviewed, the programmatic objectives determined to be funding priorities and the project activities to be undertaken. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

Impact Report, Western Pacific Tropical Research Center Research for Guam's Future, 2013; Western Pacific Tropical Research Center (WPTRC), College of Natural and Applied Sciences, University of Guam (UOG); Annually. An annual report of research and activities conducted by the WPTRC – UOG research faculty. This report covers key projects that demonstrate usefulness of research activities to the community which targets important issues in agriculture, aquaculture, and invasive species challenges.

ENVIRONMENT

Reaching for Zero: A Blueprint for Zero Waste in Guam; Guam Environmental Protection Agency and Matrix Design Group Inc.; June 2013. This two-volume report provides a recommended path to help the government and the people of Guam realize a vision of Zero Waste to preserve the environment for Guam's children and the future. Volume I presents a blueprint of key steps recommended to create a successful zero waste program

for Guam. It discusses existing and future projected conditions including a summary profile of Guam's existing solid waste management infrastructure; waste disposal quantity estimates; future solid waste generation projections and recovered material market conditions. It provides data on projected solid waste generation from 2015-2030. A timeline for implementation of the zero waste blue print is included. Volume II contains technical memoranda including stakeholder meeting conclusions, basis for job creation potential estimates, financial model and legislation recommendations and processes. White Papers are also included with discussions on plastic bag disposal ban, pay-as-you-throw trash pricing policy, illegal dumping and litter control, compost facility, and creating a sustainable funding strategy for a zero waste future on Guam.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

FY 2014 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program for Guam's Strategy for Drug Control, Violent Crime and Criminal Justice Systems Improvement Strategy; Socio-Economic Program, Bureau of Statistics and Plans; Periodically. Describes the nature and extent of Guam's drug problem, and presents a strategy to control drug trafficking and crime violence. This report presents an overview of available data on drug trafficking and arrests, and the relationship between violent crime and drugs.

This leaflet summarizes the results of water quality tests that were conducted on Guam's drinking water from January to December. It provides information on source of drinking water and identifies contaminants present in the water.
