Federal Consistency Notices



Federal consistency is a provision in the Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) that requires the federal government to comply with a state's Coastal Management Program when taking actions that are likely to affect coastal resources.

The CZMA, passed in 1973, provides for the management of the nation's coastal resources by balancing economic development with environmental conservation.

The goal of the CZMA is to "preserve, protect, develop, and where possible, to restore or enhance the resources of the nation's coastal zone. The entire island of Guam has been designated a 'coastal zone' in the context of the CZMA.

Federal Consistency reviews are conducted by the Bureau of Statistics and Plans' Network Agencies to ensure development is in compliance with Guam's enforceable land-use policies.
