STATISTICAL RELEASES

Impact of the Compacts of Free Association on Guam (FY2004 - FY2015); Planning Information Program, Bureau of Statistics and Plans, Office of the Governor; Annually. The Compact of Free Association Act of 1985 (P.L. 99-239) authorized unrestricted immigration into the United States, its territories and possessions, enabling citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI), and the Republic of Palau to enter into, lawfully engage in occupations, and establish residence as non-immigrant aliens. This report presents statistics on the cost of services provided to citizens of the

Freely Associated States living on Guam for the period FY2004 to FY2014. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

Guam Highway Safety Plan (2016); Office of Highway Safety, Department of Public Works; Annually. This plan addresses critical problem areas in highway safety in Guam and identifies projects aimed at reducing the incidence and severity of vehicular crashes on Guam's highways. Guam Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan; Department of Parks and Recreation; 2014. This plan updates Guam's Statewide Outdoor Recreation Plan which was last updated in 2006. The plan presents



a comprehensive update to the island's outdoor recreation inventory, demands, issues and trends, as well as an action plan for achieving Guam's outdoor. It addresses four program goals to enhancing the quality of outdoor recreation resources; increase the quantity of outdoor recreation resources for public awareness of available outdoor recreational resources; and encourage intergovernmental and private sector planning to meet the growing outdoor recreation needs for the territory of Guam. This report provides a list of outdoor recreation resources available on Guam. Also included is a map of island-wide parks and recreation areas. Guam Realignment Annual Report (February 01, 2016); Interagency Coordination Group of Inspectors General for Guam Realignment; Annually. This report serves as the framework for the future of U.S. force structure in Japan and the U.S. Marine Corps realignment to Guam. The report identifies project and program costs



of funds made available for military construction on Guam for the fiscal year. It includes the Department of Defense obligations and expenditures related to the Guam Realignment and provides a

ENVIRONMENTAL

Assessment of Turbidity in the Geus River Watershed in Southern Guam, Technical Report No. 156; Dr. Shahram Khosrowpanah, Dr. Mark Lander, Dr. Joseph Rouse, Bill Whitman; June 2015. This report examines the Geus Watershed by determining how different levels of rainfall trigger responses in stream level, stream flow, and turbidity. It



determines baseline hydrologic conditions by examining stream flow, stream level, turbidity, and precipitation during dry and rainy season conditions. The information is useful in assessing how future restoration or other developments affect the environmental condition of the watershed. It identifies areas that have high potential for contributing the most soil erosion within the watershed using GIS-modeling techniques and provides recommendations for watershed management strategies to help address issues with sedimentation on land and in near-shore communities. Guam Hotel and Restaurant Association Summary Statistical Report (December 2015); Guam Hotel and Restaurant Association; Monthly. Guam Visitors Bureau Arrival Monthly Statistical Report (February 2016); Guam Visitors Bureau; Monthly. Summarizes monthly visitor arrival statistics. This statistical report provides air and sea arrival data and includes visitor profile and country of origin of passenger. Also includes occupancy taxes collected for the month. AGRICULTURE

Regional Biosecurity Plan for Micronesia and Hawaii; University of Guam and the Secretariat of the Pacific Community; 2014. This four-volume report serves as a tool to enhance coordination, identify problem areas and gaps, and recommend actions that are needed to effectively address invasive alien species issues known to cause tremendous damage to the economy

and marine, freshwater and terrestrial ecosystems in the Pacific region. It was developed in part to assist



in minimizing the risk of introduction and spread of invasive species in response to the military buildup, or proposed U.S. military relocation from Okinawa to Guam and the CNMI. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

EDUCATION

Guam Community College Annual Report (2014-2015); Guam Community College; Annually. Highlights the program activities and accomplishments of the Guam Community College for the year. This annual report also presents a brief overview of each program, community partnerships, success stories, and institutional news. Financial highlights and financial statements are presented. PUBLIC SAFETY

Uniform Crime Report (2014); Guam Police Department; Annually. A statistical report showing crimes reported and provides comparison to prior years. Includes data on violent crimes, juveniles offenses, drug abuse violations, driving under the influence and family violence. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

HEALTH

Department of Public Health and Social Services Strategic Plan; Department of Public Health and Social Services; 2015-2017. This plan defines the goals and priorities of the department in order to enhance the agency's capacity to contribute to improving the health of the Guam community and reduce its physical and socio-economic burden from disease and ill health. It addresses key action items in the areas of workforce development, information technology systems, organizational structure and process, enhancements in the regulatory framework, client-focused initiatives, and sustainability. Addressing these action items enables the department to sustain an efficient, accountable, and resilient health system that delivers quality health services to the entire Guam community, leading to optimal health outcomes and high-quality health care. Guam Early Childhood State Plan (2015); Guam Early Learning Council; Annually. This plan is designed to promote the health and well-being of young children by reducing the gaps and improving the coordination of services for all young children and their families. It addresses five critical components for system improvements including health, mental health, and social emotional development, early childhood care and education, parent education and family support, and system sustainability. Program

objectives and work plan activities are included. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

Five Year Health and Social Services Strategic Plan; Office of Economic Adjustment; October 2012. This Strategic Plan is designed to improve the provision of health and social services and their outcomes on Guam. It provides a detailed look at health and social service issues on Guam and provides the policies and actions needed to guide Government of Guam agencies, federal agencies, and non-governmental organizations. Topics discussed include Healthy Guam Lifestyles, Workforce Development, Fiscal Management, Enhancing Social Welfare, Access to Care, and Addressing Communicable Diseases. CONSTRUCTION

Building Permits and Inspection Annual Report (FY2015); Department of Public Works; Annually. A statistical report representing number of building permits issued by village and type of building. Includes total construction cost and permit fees. Available: Department of Public Works or the Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

HOUSING

Guam Five-Year Consolidated Plan 2015-2019 and Annual Action Plan Program year 2015; Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority. This plan addresses the needs of the community including the housing, public housing, homeless and non-housing community development needs. It describes the community engagement process to identify strategies

and priorities that address the housing, living environments, and economic opportunities for low and moderate income persons. The plan also incorporates a market analysis that provides an overview of the number and types of housing units, cost and condition of housing, public and assisted housing, and special needs facilities and services. Topics include housing market analysis, public housing, homeless needs assessment, affordable housing and barriers to affordable housing. GOVERNMENT

The Executive Budget for the Territory of Guam (FY 2017); Bureau of Budget and Management Research; Annually. This report presents the Executive Budget request for the fiscal year. It includes a summary request for fiscal year operations.



The report also provides an overview of revenues and expenditures and statement and activity descriptions, it presents Guam's economic outlook, and provides a listing of federal programs inventory. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection
