AGRICULTURE

Western Pacific Tropical Research Center Impact Report (2016);



Western Pacific Tropical Research Center (WPTRC), College of Natural and Applied Sciences, University of Guam; Annually.

This annual report highlights projects and activities conducted by the Western Pacific Tropical Research Center to address challenges to Guam's agriculture industry as well as its natural resources. It presents outcomes of studies and projects undertaken for the year to better sustain and manage our environment in the areas of agriculture, aquaculture and invasive species. Approaches to Children's Healthy Living are discussed. Guam State Wildlife Action Plan (2016); Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Services, Department of Agriculture. This document replaces the Guam Comprehensive Wildlife Conservation Strategy Plan in defining the species of animals that have the greatest conservation need, important habitats and their condition, conservation actions, monitoring of these species, and gauging conservation success. The Plan outlines key habitat types for terrestrial and aquatic organisms and addresses the management of Guam's conservation areas including the terrestrial conservation areas, the Marine Preserves, freshwater conservation areas, and federal marine conservation areas. It

identifies Guam's Coral Reef Initiative Coordinating Committee local action strategies and includes the endangered and threatened species list for Guam. Available: Bureau of Statistics and Plans Resource Collection

PUBLIC SAFETY

Juvenile Justice Comprehensive Community Supervision 2016 Strategic Plan; Judiciary of Guam. The 2016 Juvenile Justice Comprehensive Community Supervision Strategic Plan is a comprehensive plan that addresses juvenile justice programs and services. The plan identifies the goals and objectives of the program along with program progress and the outcome indicators. Additionally, recommendations for improving data measurements, analysis, collection, reporting, and use of recidivism data are included. A self-assessment was conducted to evaluate the Evidence-based Practices, Juvenile Court Referral Process, Juvenile Defense and Prosecution Standards and Court Language. The results with the completion of the Juvenile Justice Agency Leaders and Managers Checklist are included. Appendices include Existing Electronic Infrastructure, Violation Rubric, Guam Probation System Recommendations for 2015, and Sanctions and Incentives Process. 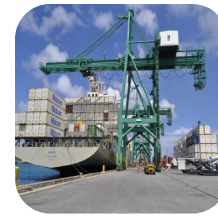


Uniform Crime Report (2015); Guam Police Department; Annually. A statistical report showing crimes reported and provides comparison to prior years. Includes data on
