- Since 2017, Guam has had **5,336 participants** REMOVED **36,266 pounds** of trash, covered 30 miles (50 km) long and 4 to 12 Miles (6 to 19 km) wide



The Guam International Coastal Cleanup is funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce, National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) through the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended, administered by the office of Guam Coastal Management Program (GCMP) of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans, Government of Guam through Cooperative Agreement Award NA17NOS4190202

The International Coastal Cleanup begun more than 30 years ago, when communities rallied together with the common goal of collecting and documenting the trash littering their coastline. ICC has grown immensely in the past years since the first cleanup. Volunteers from states and territories throughout the U.S. and more than 100 countries come together each year and participate in the cleanup event near them.

- 1,360,609 people have participated
- 26,967 locations around the world
- 50,634,290 lbs. of trash removed
- 45,760 miles covered
