

Federal Consistency is a provision in the Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) that requires federal agencies to comply to the maximum extent practicable with a state's enforceable policies when taking an action that has reasonably foreseeable effects on coastal uses and resources.

The CZMA provides for the management of the nation's coastal uses and resources, balancing economic development with environmental conservation. The goal of the CZMA is to "preserve, protect, develop, and where possible, to restore or enhance the resources of the nation's coastal zone for this and succeeding generations." The entire island of Guam has been designated a 'coastal zone' in the context of the CZMA.

Federal Consistency reviews are conducted by the Bureau of Statistics and Plans with its Network Agencies to ensure federal actions are in compliance with Guam's enforceable policies to the maximum extent practicable.
