Guåhan 2050 Sustainability Plan Overview and Progress



PL 35-110 was passed on 12/20/2025. This law amended §§ 1203, 1206, 1209(H), 1210, 1211, And 1214 Of Article 2, Chapter 1, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated. Amendments are relative to renewing the Guam Comprehensive Development Plan to encompass the principles of sustainability. This renewal would be titled the Guåhan 2050 Sustainability Plan.

Prior to the draft of this plan, BSP and it's consultants:

- Assessed agency roles, integration, and capacity. This involved multiple roundtables with Government Agencies and agency interviews (agencies including Autonomous Agencies and Lower and Higher Education institutions on Guam)
- Analyzed local laws, regulations and government plans. This
 included plans that are in the works and have yet to be adopted
 e.g. Habitat Conservation Plan
- Created a comprehensive plan and policy map.
- Engaged with the public through 3 public surveys at different stages of this project and 3 public meetings covering the southern, central, and northern areas of Guam.

All of the activities and tasks that have led up to the current draft are documented in the draft. This includes survey results and agency input that helped formulate the contents of this plan.

If the GSP 2050 is passed by the legislature or lapsed into approval, a 5 year action plan would go into effect to implement the plan.

The draft plan includes an "Implementation Action Matrix" that provides a detailed, action-oriented framework for realizing the goals, policies, and principles of the Guåhan 2050 Sustainability Plan. Organized by thematic chapters of the plan—including governance, land use, economic development, environmental protection, cultural vitality, and village sustainability—the matrix outlines specific strategies to be carried out by lead agencies in collaboration with partner institutions and community stakeholders. It is a practical tool to coordinate efforts across sectors and ensure that the vision of G50SP is advanced through timely, accountable, and measurable steps.

Each action listed in the matrix is tied to a major policy area within the plan and includes key implementation details: the responsible agency, supporting partners, timeframe for execution, necessary resources, and clear performance indicators. This format supports transparency, monitoring, and adaptive management—allowing the Government of Guam and its partners to track progress, adjust priorities, and ensure continuous alignment with the plan's five sustainability principles and overarching goals. The matrix will also guide annual and five-year progress reviews, informing future budget allocations, program development, and policy updates needed to maintain momentum and remain responsive to emerging challenges.
