

Fishing at Agana Boat Basin

Angling and talaya are the only approved methods of fishing in the Boat Basin.

(From the basin to 50 feet from the western edge of the Boat Basin channel.)

No more than 3 hooks can be used when angling.

No snagging of fish is allowed.

Cast nets/ talaya are allowed in the channel and mooring areas from 4 a.m. to 8 a.m.

No drag net (tekin) can be used within the Boat Basin.

Commercial Sale & Local Sale

You must have a license to commercially harvest trochus. The season closes if the limit is met. Trochus can not be commercially exported.

Only 10,000 trochus can be taken per year for the whole island. Trochus for commercial use must have a base diameter of 4 inches or longer. Trochus can not be harvested commercially from the shore to the outer edge of the fringing reef. No trochus can be taken from the marine preserves.

Personal Use

Trochus are limited to 50 pieces per person per day. Trochus must be kept whole until cooked or frozen. No Trochus can be taken from the five marine preserves. **Trochus** for personal use must have a base diameter of 3 inches or longer.

No more than 20 trochus caught on Guam can be hand carried off Guam for personal use.

Mahonghang, Papangpang, **Panglao**

Lobsters and crabs carrying eggs can not be taken.

Spiny lobsters must have a carapace longer than 3.5 inches and may be only taken for personal use.


Slipper lobsters and crabs must have a carapace longer than 2 inches and may be only taken for personal use.

Lobsters and crabs can not be commercially exported. Do not puncture, spear or impale a lobster or crab when catching it. No lobsters or crabs can be taken from the marine preserves.

Hima (Tridacna Clams)

Giant clams can only be taken for personal use. Clams must be 7 inches across the valve or longer. One person can take 3 clams, shell included, per day. Clams must be kept whole until cooked or frozen. Clams, or shells of clams, can not be sold, traded, bartered or exported. No clams can be taken from the marine preserves.

Other marine mollusks

Marine snails, clams, oysters and scallops (not aliling or hima) can only be taken for personal use and can not be sold, traded, bartered or exported.

One person can take 30 pieces, shell included, of marine snails, clams, oysters and scallops per day.

Ornamental shell collectors shall be limited to 10 pieces per species and can have the shell without preserving the animal. Any fragment of shell counts as 1 piece.

The personal harvest of selected dogas (conchs) is allowed but **only 1,000** conchs per day is allowed. The following species can be harvested: Strombus Fragilis, Strombus Gibberelus and Strombus Luhuanes.

No marine snails, clams, oysters and scallops (not aliling or hima) or conchs can be taken from the marine preserves.

Marine snails, clams, oysters and scallops (not aliling or hima) must be kept whole until cooked or frozen.

of the **Marine Preserves** extend to the 600 ft. contour and the inland boundaries of the **Marine Preserves** extend in 10 meters from the mean high tide mark or to the nearest edge of a public right-of-way, which ever comes first. This rule does not include Sasa Bay Preserve.
