Local population projected on basis of a compound growth rate of 2.5%; similar data applied to all other categories except Military, which was estimated.

SUBJECT POPULATION PROJECTIONS

There is enclosed an excerpt from the U.S. Census 1970, showing population of Guam by election districts, a revision by the undersigned, separating military attached from civilian residents, and a population projection initiated by the Planning Division of the Department of Land Management, and reevaluated in the light of the 1970 U.S. Census by the undersigned.

The present rate of natural increase in the local population, births minus deaths, is approximately 2300. (The average for the years 1961-69 has been 2280). Projecting this natural population increase to 1980, and doubling to take care of contemplated migration, the civilian population would increase by approximately 50,000 in the 10 year time frame.

Projected community growth through 1980 is based on availability of land, available and contemplated infrastructure, and economic feasibility of development.

Projections are considered realistic, but conservative.

Population Counts for States

(This report is based on preliminary counts of the population as compiled in the 1970 census field offices. The series consists of 57 reports—number 1 for the United States; numbers 2 through 52 for the States and the District of Columbia in alphabetical order, rather than in order of publication; and numbers 53 through 57 for Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and Canal Zone, respectively.)

As of April 1, 1970, the population of Guam was 86,926, according to a preliminary count of the returns of the 1970 census. This figure represents an increase of 19,882, or 29.7 percent, from the 67,044 inhabitants enumerated in the 1960 census.

This report presents preliminary 1970 counts for the area, each election district, and each place of 1,000 inhabitants or more. These preliminary figures will be superseded by the final counts to be shown in Final Report Series PC(1)-A which will be issued next year. The final figures may differ from the preliminary counts for a number of reasons.

A. Population

The population of Guam may be divided into two main categories: local and military. Local population may be further subdivided into the following classifications: Guamanian, Statesider, Filipino, and Other. Table No. 3, opposite, furnishes population data for the years 1960 through 1970, with projections to 1977.

Projections to 1977 were made by applying a compound growth rate of 2.5% to 1970 data for Local population and estimating that of the Military & Dependents. Total Local population at 1970 stood at 67,892; Total Population, at 86,929. For 1977, Total Local was estimated at 80,707; and Total Population, at 103,702.

In all years, the Guamanian population accounted for the largest segment of Local population, or 76.5% in 1970. The next largest segment, Statesiders, accounted for 10.7%. The distribution of population in all years is essentially an estimate, and classifications here used may differ when detailed 1970 census data become available.

Estimates of population in military base areas, for the years 1969 and 1970, show a drop from 1967, and differ from the earlier figures shown for 1962-1965, which were reported to have been supplied by the United States Department of Defense.

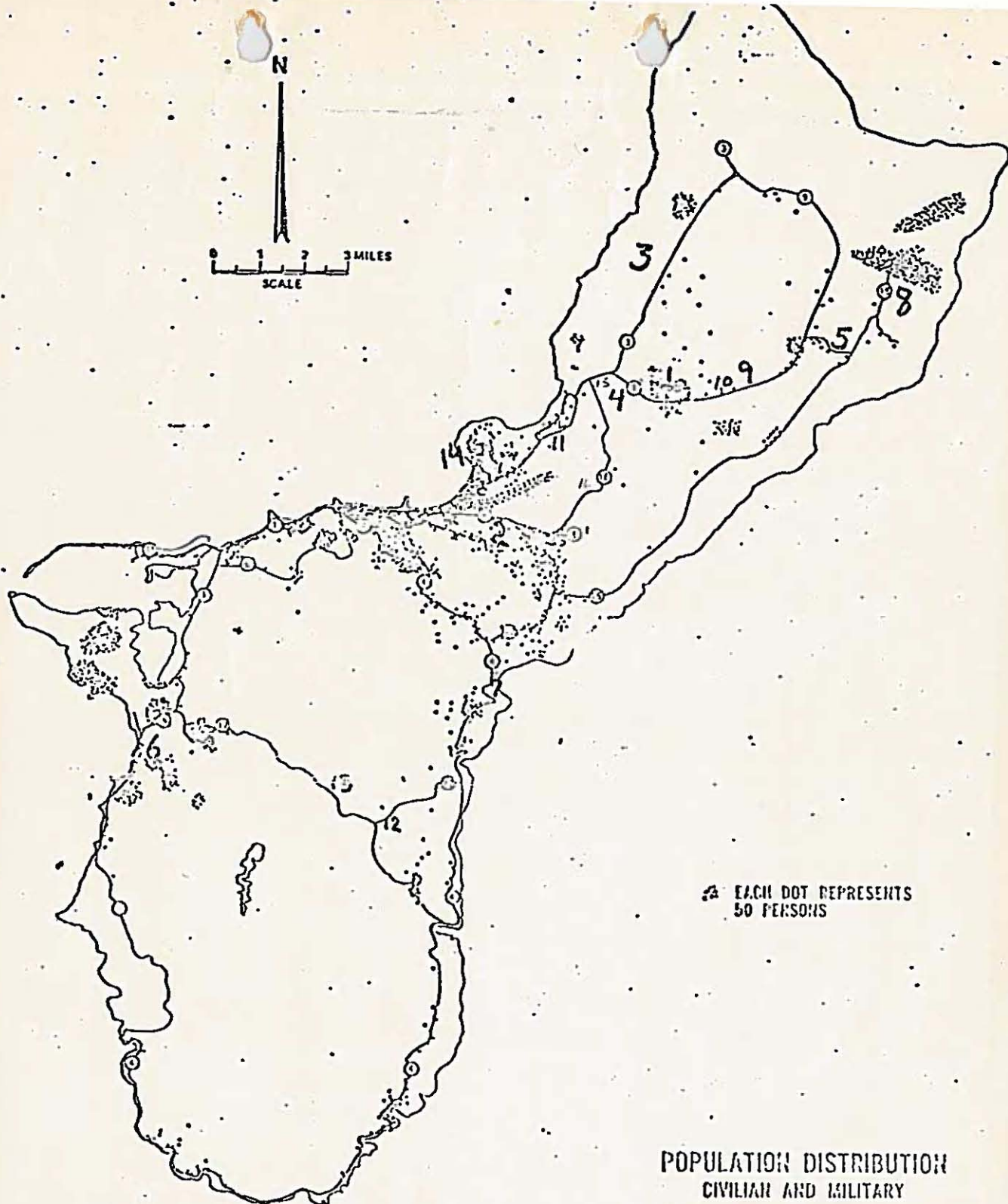
SUBJECT Population Growth and New Development

Enclosed is a list of recent and pending residential construction on Guam, followed by a map which is keyed to the numbers on that list to show location of the developments on the Island.

The total number of units is 5618 (counting the 218 houses in Tract 112 sold in 1970 and 1971). Of this, the 200 unit project by Fujita, the 280 unit project by Magic Homes, and the 400 units by Tom Gentry are not definite, so that projecting 5618 units most probably overstates the number.

Also enclosed is an analysis of population trends based on L. M. data, modified to reflect 1970 census data and also residential construction as per aforementioned list. The population from 1970 to 1975 is projected to increase by a total of 29,574, which at the rate of 5.2 persons per household (the value 5.2 is derived from 1970 census data which shows 86,926 individuals in 16,726 households), indicates a need for 5,687 new units. If, as above and including the three questionable projects, 5618 units are in fact built, this would nevertheless be insufficient to fully meet the demand generated by the increase in population, and would allow for no replacement of substandard units.

Population Statistics for Boy Scout Council

There are enclosed a Guam population projection for the next ten years and the projected population of boys for the next ten years listed by village or housing area, separated into four age groups, 6 through 8, 9 through 11, 12 through 14 and 15 through 17 years.

Projections on the island's boy population are based on studies conducted by the Guam Department of Education in 1970, determining place of student residence, substantiating the need of certain federal government programs.

In 1970, of 10,479 boys between 6 and 17 years of age on Guam, approximately 13% were dependents of military personnel or of persons working for the military. Military personnel are not expected to increase noticeably in numbers during this next decade and a majority of boy dependents will be in the lower age bracket. By 1980, it is anticipated that Guam boy population between ages of 6 and 17 will number over 15,000, a 10 year increase of approximately 35%.
