

# Follow-up Survey of Resources for Diabetes Prevention and Control in Guam

# Acknowledgements

This survey provides updated information as a follow-up to the initial assessment of existing resources for diabetes prevention and control on Guam in 2009.

Health Partners, L.L.C. conducted the survey for the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services Diabetes Prevention and Control Program, through a grant from the US Department of Health and Human Services Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC Grant Number: 1U58DP005057-01). Ms. Su Bin Jin was the Research Assistant for this project, responsible for data collection and data entry.

Mr. Luces, Program Coordinator for the DPHSS Diabetes Prevention and Control Program, assisted in identifying survey participants and coordinating communications with participants. The members of the Guam Diabetes Control Coalition, headed by Dr. Melinda Sangalang, provided a peer review of the survey methodology and facilitated the conduct of the survey within their own institutions.

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### Introduction

Diabetes remains a serious public health challenge in Guam. Diabetes prevalence is similar to the US mainland, with about 1 in 10 adults reporting a diagnosis¹. However, mortality from diabetes is markedly higher in Guam, with a cause-specific mortality rate in 2010 of 39.9 per 100,000 compared to 22.3 per 100,000 in the US² (Table 1). As of 2011, diabetes ranked 4<sup>th</sup> among the top ten causes of death in the island, accounting for nearly 6% of all deaths³. Moreover, diabetes contributes to elevate the risk for heart disease and cerebrovascular disease, which are leading causes of mortality.

Diabetes care is expensive and chronic. The health burden is compounded by the high direct cost of treatment and care of diabetes complications, including heart disease, vascular disease, renal failure and blindness. Furthermore, diabetes raises the cost of care for chronic conditions like end stage renal disease (ESRD); in one nationwide study, patients with ESRD and diabetes incurred health care costs that were 25% higher than non-diabetic ESRD patients<sup>4</sup>. Thus, the prevention and control of diabetes are public health priorities for Guam.

The Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) is the designated lead agency responsible for addressing the problem of diabetes. Since the initial resource inventory in 2009, the DPHSS Diabetes Prevention and Control Program actively partnered with other stakeholders in the community to establish Guam's Noncommunicable Disease Prevention and Control (NCD) Coalition, contributing to develop Guam's 1<sup>st</sup> NCD prevention and control action plan. In 2014, the NCD Action Plan was updated for the next 5-year cycle (2014-2018); diabetes prevention and control figured prominently in the Plan.

Building upon the initial resource inventory in 2009, this survey represents a systematic effort to collect and collate information on available services and expertise relevant to diabetes prevention and control. It is anticipated that this inventory will serve as a valuable resource for diabetes and NCD prevention/control program planners, service providers and diabetes patients and their families. Moreover, this report begins to track changes in resource availability for diabetes prevention and control over time, and to assess compliance with American Diabetes Association (ADA) Recommended Standards of Care, as a direct response to the stated goals, objectives and activities of the Diabetes Prevention and Control section of the Guam NCD Strategic Plan.

The contents of this inventory reflect the best efforts of Health Partners, L.L.C. and DPHSS to assimilate and organize information provided by the various agencies, institutions, establishments and individual service providers who responded to an island-wide survey. The survey was voluntary; hence only those entities that participated are represented in the publication.

# **KEY MESSAGE:**

Diabetes prevalence in Guam is similar to the USA, but diabetes kills more people in Guam.

Diabetes care is **expensive and chronic**.

Costs are born by families and by the health care system.

Thus, the prevention and control of diabetes are public health and socio-economic priorities for Guam.

# Methodology

The scope of the resource assessment was discussed and agreed upon by DPHSS and Health Partners, LLC with input from members of the diabetes coalition. A search for potential providers of diabetes prevention and control services was done using data from the Guam Medical and Allied Health Professional Licensing Boards, the Yellow Pages of the both phone books used on Guam, relevant directories of health professionals published or maintained by the Guam Medical Society and the Guam Medical Association and an electronic search on Google. In addition, DPHSS program staff and staff members from organizations working in the area of diabetes control were queried regarding possible diabetes service providers.

All identified service providers were invited to participate in a voluntary service provider survey. The survey instrument utilized in the 2009 resource inventory was reviewed and updated, and distributed to all invited survey participants. Survey forms were distributed by fax, e-mail or in person. Follow-up phone calls and visits were conducted to maximize the response rate. All survey participants were informed at the outset of the nature and purpose of the survey, and verbal informed consent obtained from all respondents.

An electronic database was developed using Microsoft Excel to record entries in submitted survey forms. Quantitative data were analyzed using summary statistics and percentages. Qualitative data were recorded, and re-classification or thematic analysis done when needed. Whenever possible, comparisons to 2009 data were done, to document changes in the resource availability and compliance with clinical practice guidelines for diabetes care. We also looked at geographic distribution of diabetes resources to assess accessibility.

Because healthy eating and regular exercise are crucial to prevention and effective control of diabetes, sources of fresh fruits and vegetables and physical activity resources were included in the systematic search for diabetes resources. The data collected were added to the electronic resource inventory.

To assist the general population in locating diabetes resource on island, we attempted to enter all the information collected into Google Maps. Prior to this mapping exercise, Google maps only had 4 service providers listed for Guam. Because Google Maps subjects all data entries to an internal validation procedure, not all of the data we entered was accepted; however, a majority of the entries were published, resulting in a more richly populated resource map for Guam.


## Results

#### Response rate


Seventy-five (75) service providers were identified and sent survey forms. Of these, sixty (60) returned completed forms, for a response rate of 80%.

## **Respondent Demographics**

The respondents represented predominantly private sector commercial or for-profit entities (Figure 1), primarily made up of private clinical practices with group or solo health practitioners. About 12% of respondents represented local government agencies, including the mayors' offices in various villages. About 8% were private sector not-for-profit agencies or nongovernmental organizations (NGOs). Faith-based groups made up about 2% of the respondent total. There were no respondents representing federal agencies.





The primary nature of services offered corresponded with the nature of the organization, with majority of the respondents offering clinical services (68%) followed by "other" – pharmacy services and provision of medical equipment (17%) - and ancillary health services (10%). Health education made up 7% while health financing accounted for 5% (Figure 2). (Note: Some respondents reported 2 or more primary services, so the total exceeds 100%.)




#### Populations served

Respondents were equally likely to report serving males as well as females, and elderly and adults as well as children and youth (Figure 3). Respondents were also similarly likely (>80%) to serve Chamorros, Filipinos and Caucasians. Respondents were less likely to report offering services to other Pacific Islanders and other Asians (Figure 4). Over half of respondents reported serving special populations, namely the homeless, people living with HIV/AIDS, pregnant women and the lesbian/gay/bisexual/transgender (LGBT) community. However, the homeless and people living with HIV/AIDS were less likely than pregnant women and LGBT to be reported as populations served (Figure 5).








The providers surveyed reported serving the homeless, people living with HIV/AIDs, other Pacific Islanders and other Asians less frequently than other population sub-groups.


### Services provided

The most frequently reported services offered by the provider respondents are clinical (Figure 6): preventive services (66%), screening and diagnostic services (63%), treatment (61%) and ancillary services (54%). A little over half of the providers surveyed provide diabetes education services. One-quarter collect data on diabetes and about 12% offer financial support services. Research is the least commonly provided service, with only 5% of providers reporting that they perform some form of research on diabetes.




## **Educational services**

Of the 39 providers who provide diabetes education services, nearly 80% provide general education on diabetes and one-third (33%) provide education on specific aspects of diabetes care, such as education on injecting insulin, nutrition counseling and diabetes foot care. Education is offered most frequently to diabetes patients and their families, the general population and caregivers (Figure 7).



## Preventive services

Two-thirds (66%) of respondents reported offering preventive services for diabetics. Counseling on the prevention of overt diabetes through nutrition and exercise and advising those who smoke/use tobacco to quit were the most frequently provided preventive services (Figure 8).





Screening and diagnostic services

Sixty-three percent (63%) of providers reported offering screening and diagnostic services. Figures 9-11 delineate the specific laboratory, radiologic and clinical screening and diagnostic services provided.

#### Treatment services

Sixty-one percent (61%) of respondents reported providing treatment services for diabetes. Three-fourths (75%) provide outpatient services while one-fourth (25%) provide inpatient services. Table 2 lists the number and percentage of providers and the specific categories of treatment services offered.

#### Ancillary services

Over half (54%) of respondents reported offering ancillary services to persons with diabetes. The types of ancillary services offered are depicted in Figure 12.

Currently, there are 2 local endocrinology consultants that service providers can refer clients/patients to for the diagnosis and management of complex cases: Dr. Joel Rubio (Health Partners, L.L.C.) and Dr. Erika Alford (American Medical Clinic). Of the 63% of service providers who refer to local endocrinologists, 42% and 47% specifically refer to Dr. Rubio for diagnosis and management, respectively, of complex cases while 11% refer to Dr. Alford. For counseling and nutrition support, providers refer most frequently to the Seventh Day Adventist clinic (26%) and Dr. Rubio (11%). Over one-third of respondents reported making referrals to off-island centers for services not available locally. Hawaii and the Philippines were the most frequently cited locations for off-island referrals.



## Financial services

Twelve percent (12%) of respondents provide financial services for diabetes care. 100% of these providers offer health care insurance coverage, and in addition, 14% also provide personal loans for diabetes care.

#### Data collection

About one-fourth (26%) or providers collect data on diabetes. Of those who collect data, 93% collect clinical data on individual patients, 13% collect epidemiological data and 7% collect data on diabetes service utilization and costs. None of the respondents reported collecting data primarily for research.

#### Diabetes research

Three respondents (5%) reported providing research services for diabetes. All 3 conduct epidemiologic research or contribute to registry data. Two of the 3 are self-funded; the other respondent did not provide information on research funding sources.

#### Other services

Respondents identified the following additional services provided to diabetics and their families:

- Home health services
- Diabetes self-management education
- Wound care
- Physical therapy
- Advocacy
- Patient navigation
- Provision of medication and diabetic equipment and supplies

Respondents also identified services that need to be established or augmented in the local community:

- Recruitment of diabetes educators, diabetes nutritionists and other diabetes specialists
- Additional resources to assist indigent diabetics
- Greater capacity and resources for preventive services
- Self-management classes and training workshops
- Outreach and educational services and materials in other relevant languages
- Fitness and nutrition programs to provide diabetics with physical activity and healthy eating opportunities

## Awareness of local resources for diabetes services

Respondents were asked to identify local agencies/groups/organizations providing services for diabetic patients. The Guam Diabetes Association was pinpointed by over half of the respondents, followed by the Seventh Day Adventist Guam Clinic (41%) and the Department of Public Health and Social Services (27%).

## Clinical practice characteristics


Of the 60 respondents, 45 identified themselves as clinical practice providers. These respondents were asked additional questions regarding their practice characteristics.

The most commonly identified local resources for diabetes services in Guam:

- Guam Diabetes
   Association
- 2. Seventh Day Adventist Guam clinic
- 3. DPHSS

Nearly one in four (24%) clinical diabetes service providers reported that 0-25% of their patients are diabetics. One in three (36%) have 26-50% of their clientele with a diagnosis of diabetes and another one-third (33%) have over 50 to 75% of their patient base with a diabetes diagnosis. Three respondents (7%) have over 75% of their patient/client base with diabetes (Figure 13).






The number of specially trained diabetes health professionals is outlined in Table 3. The survey findings reflect the continued scarcity in human resources for diabetes prevention and control on Guam.

Self-pay (81%) and local private insurance plans (78%) are the payment plans most commonly accepted by the providers. Social insurance (61%), other private insurance (59%) and military insurance (54%) are less frequently accepted (Figure 14).




# Comparison with 2009

In 2009, a baseline survey was conducted to identify and inventory the diabetes services in Guam. The original survey instrument was also utilized for the current survey, to allow comparisons and to determine if change occurred over time.





Compared to 2009, more diabetes service providers were identified in 2014, and the response rate to the survey was slightly higher (Table 4). The 2014 survey had more private sector for-profit respondents and fewer local government agency respondents (Figure 15).

The number of providers across all categories of diabetes services increased over the 5-year period, except for research, which remained unchanged (Figure 16). Providers offering preventive services also increased overall, with the largest changes occurring for nutrition and exercise counseling and brief tobacco cessation advice (Figure 17). The one exception was for immunization other than pneumococcal vaccinations, which did not change over time.





Greater numbers of treatment service providers were observed, with the largest increases noted for outpatient and inpatient management of diabetes. Smaller increases were noted for treatment of neurologic, cardiac and ophthalmologic complications. However, a decrease occurred for treatment of vascular complications of diabetes and non-dialysis treatment of diabetes-related kidney disease (Figure 18). The number of dialysis providers remained unchanged.






Figure 19. Number of providers offering ancillary services for diabetes care, 2009 vs. 2014

Ancillary services had the greatest increases in nutrition and dietary counseling, clinical counseling and nursing support. More modest increases were observed in referrals to local specialists, spiritual counseling, pain management, patient navigation and provision of diabetes supplies and equipment. Referrals to offisland centers remained steady, while patient advocacy decreased (Figure 19).

Figure 18. Number of providers offering treatment for diabetes and diabetes complications, 2009 vs. 2014

Health professionals specially trained for diabetes care increased in numbers slightly over the 5-year period, with the largest increase noted for diabetes educators (Figure 20). Still, the numbers remain too low in proportion to the population of diabetics on island.




# Geographic distribution of service providers

We compiled the contact details of the various service providers into an inventory of diabetes resources and entered these into Goggle Maps. In determining the geographic distribution of these providers, we used the Guam school district classification:

- North (Lagu): Yigo, Dededo
- East (Kattan): Barrigada, Chalan Pago-Ordot, Mangilao, Mongmong-Toto-Maite
- Central (Luchan): Agana Heights, Asan Maina, Hagatna, Piti, Sinajana, Tamuning
- South (Haya): Agat, Inarajan, Merizo, Santa Rita, Talofofo, Umatac, Yona

Figure 21 delineates the geographic distribution of (1) individual service providers, (2) clinics, (3) laboratories and (4) pharmacies and compares these with the population geographic distribution across the 4 districts.

The data reveal that service providers and points of service for diabetes prevention and care are not proportionately distributed to equitably serve the population across the 4 districts of Guam. While the largest percentage of the island population are located in the North (Lagu), laboratories, clinics, pharmacies and individual providers are largely concentrated in the Central (Luchan) district. The South (Haya) remains the least served of the 4 districts, with no laboratories, 1 clinic (DPHSS Southern Community Health Center), 1 pharmacy and 2 individual practitioners, both of whom practice out of the DPHSS Southern Community Health Center.

## Discussion and conclusions

This was a follow-up survey to the 2009 baseline inventory of diabetes resources in Guam. Using the same methodology and survey instrument, a total of 75 service providers were identified; of these, 80% provided data for 2014. Compared to 2009, there were more for-profit private sector respondents and fewer local government agency survey participants.

Compared to 2009, more service providers reported serving special populations and ethnic minorities. However, the homeless, persons living with HIV/AIDs, other Pacific Islanders and other Asians were less likely to be reported as a sub-group served by the providers. Assuming diabetes prevalence is uniformly distributed across all population sub-groups, these sub-groups are relatively underserved, either because they do not avail of diabetes prevention and control services as much as the rest of the population or they encounter barriers to accessing available services. Regardless, indicates the need for sustained outreach services to these particular population sub-groups. In addition, the need persists to further explore what barriers to diabetes service exist for these groups.

The 2014 data revealed that overall, the proportion of service providers offering preventive, diagnostic, treatment and ancillary health services to diabetics increased over time. In contrast, research on diabetes remained unchanged. For preventive services, the largest increases occurred for brief tobacco cessation advice and nutrition/diet/exercise advice—these may reflect greater awareness and capacity among health care providers arising from efforts of the Guam Tobacco Control program, the NCD Coalition and the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition, all of which have highlighted tobacco cessation, nutrition and physical activity as priorities in their respective strategic action plans. The one preventive strategy that remained unchanged over the 5 years was immunization with vaccines other than pneumococcal vaccine. This represents an area where greater advocacy and provider training may be needed.

In general, there were increases in the number of treatment providers for both outpatient and inpatient management of diabetes and its complications, except for the treatment of vascular complications. Guam lost its vascular surgeon shortly after the 2009 survey, and a replacement has not yet been recruited. Still, the expected influx of medical and nursing professionals to staff the soon-to-open hospital (Guam Regional Medical City) may further augment the pool of diabetes treatment providers.

The analysis of the geographic distribution of service providers and points of health care delivery reveal inequities, with a disproportionate concentration of facilities and practitioners in the Central district, despite larger populations in the North and East districts. The South remains the least served, with no laboratories and

only 1 clinic and pharmacy for the entire district. Hence, it is imperative to consider re-distributing diabetes resources to ensure better geographic access for the more populated and least served districts of the island.

This follow-up survey reveals improvements in the numbers of providers and types of services offered for diabetes prevention and care in Guam, likely as a result of the strategic advocacy and interventions undertaken by the DPHSS Diabetes Prevention and Control Program in partnership with the Guam Diabetes Association and other community partners, such as the NCD Coalition and the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition. Gaps and challenges remain, particularly in relation to the paucity of specially trained diabetes providers and in the equitable distribution of points of service. Furthermore, this survey was not designed to assess the quality of services. Nonetheless, this is a vital issue that will be partially addressed in the forthcoming survey of diabetes patients in 2015. In the future, the Guam Diabetes Coalition and DPHSS may consider undertaking a more comprehensive assessment of the quality of diabetes prevention and control services in Guam.
