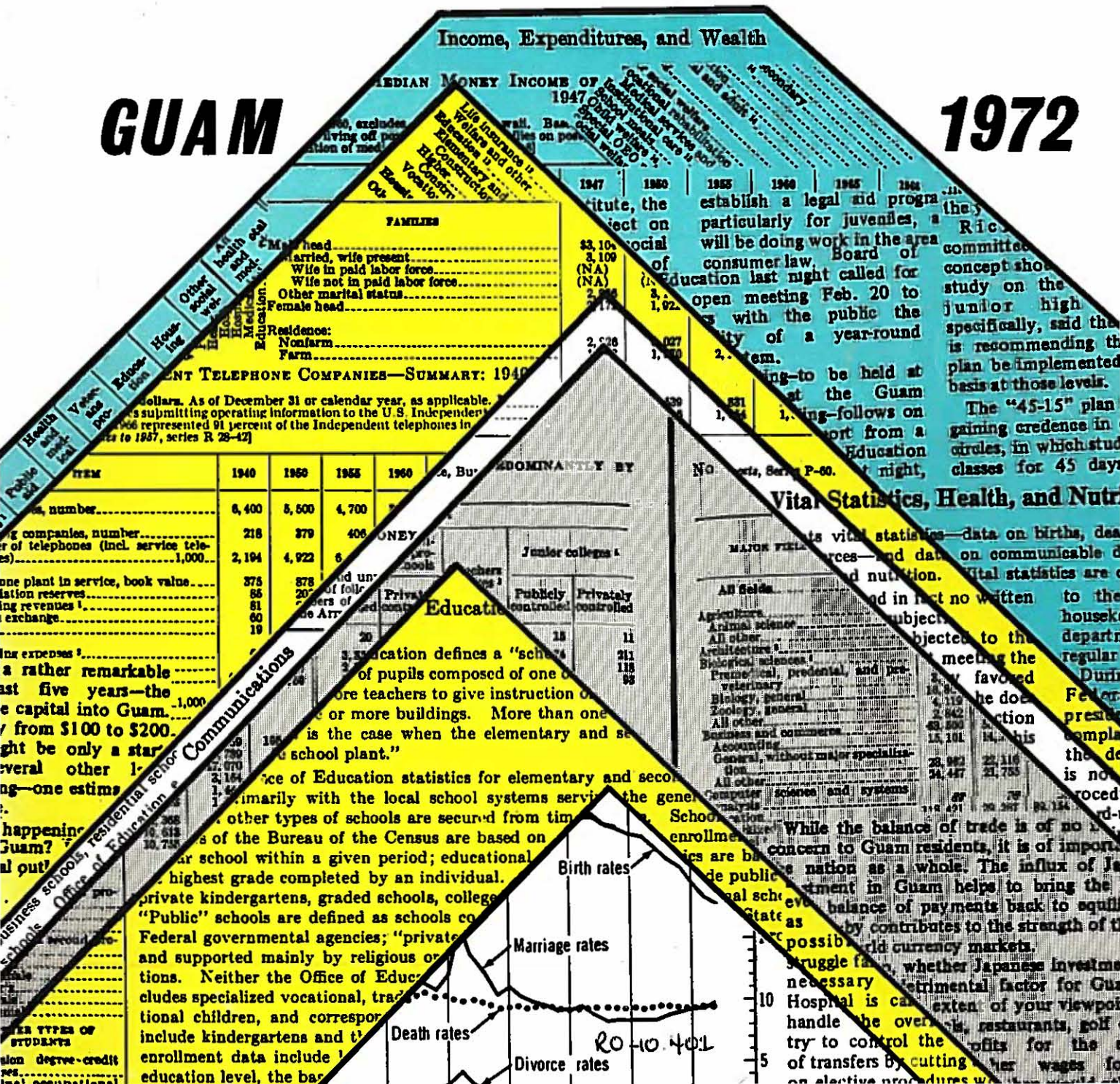

General

This report presents statistics from the 1970 Census of Population on the number of inhabitants of the area, its districts and islands and their subdivisions, and places. Legal provision for this census, which was conducted as of April 1, 1970, was made in the Act of Congress of August 31, 1954 (amended August 1957), which codified Title 13, United States Code. The law provides for the inclusion of outlying areas of U.S. sovereignty or jurisdiction. The 1970 enumeration included the following areas: American Samoa, the Canal Zone, Guam, the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and the Virgin Islands of the United States. Comparable statistics from earlier censuses also are presented in this report.

A major portion of the information compiled from the 1970 Census of Population will appear in Volume 1, Characteristics of the Population, of which this report is part. Collection and processing procedures. — The 1970 census in this area was conducted through direct interview. Enumerators visited each household to collect the information. A single questionnaire was used, which contained all the questions to be asked about every person and household.

The 1970 census questionnaires were specially designed to be processed by FOSDIC (Film Optical Sensing Device for Input to Computers). Enumerators (and for some few items, census clerks) marked the answers in predesignated positions which could be "read" by FOSDIC, from a microfilm copy of the questionnaire, onto computer magnetic tape. A more detailed description of the data collection and processing procedures can be obtained from the Bureau of the Census. Percents and symbols. — Percents which round to less than 0.1 are not shown, but indicated as zero. A dash "—" signifies zero. Three dots "... " mean not applicable. A minus sign preceding a figure denotes decrease. The symbol "NA" means not available.

Boundaries. — The data shown for 1970 relate to the boundaries of the areas as they existed on January 1, 1970. Information on changes between 1960 and 1970 for certain types of areas are given in footnotes to the appropriate tables. Unless otherwise indicated, the data shown for 1960 and previous years relate to the areas as defined at the time of the particular census.

USUAL PLACE OF RESIDENCE

In accordance with census practice dating back to the earliest census, each person enumerated in the 1970 census was counted as an inhabitant of his usual place of residence, which is generally construed to mean the place where he lives and sleeps most of the time. This place is not necessarily the same as his legal residence, voting residence, or domicile. In the vast majority of cases, however, the use of these different bases of classification would produce substantially the same statistics, although there may be appreciable differences for a few areas.

The implementation of this practice has resulted in the establishing of residence rules for certain categories of persons whose usual place of residence is not immediately clear. Furthermore, this practice means that persons were not always counted as residents of the place where they happened to be found by the census enumerators. Persons without a usual place of residence were, however, counted where they were enumerated.

Members of the Armed Forces living on military installations were counted as residents of the area in which the installation was located. Members of the Armed Forces not living on a military installation were counted as residents of the area in which they were living. Crews of U.S. Navy vessels were counted as residents of the home port to which the particular vessel was assigned, crews of vessels deployed to the overseas fleet were therefore not included in the resident population. Persons in Armed Forces families were counted where they were living on Census Day (e.g., the military installation, "off-base," or elsewhere, as the case might be.) Crews of U.S. merchant marine vessels were counted as part of the population of the U.S. port in which their vessel was berthed on Census Day. Crews of all other U.S. merchant marine vessels (are not included in the resident population.)

College students, as in 1950 and 1960, were counted as residents of the area in which they were living while attending college. Inmates of institutions, who ordinarily live there for considerable periods of time, were counted as residents of the area where the institution was located; on the other hand, patients in general hospitals, who ordinarily remain for short periods of time, were counted at their homes.

Americans who were in foreign countries for an extended period (in the Armed Forces, working at civilian jobs, studying in foreign universities, etc.) are not included in the resident population. On the other hand, persons temporarily away on vacations, business trips, and the like, were counted at their usual residence. Information on such persons was obtained from other members of their families, landladies, etc. If an entire family was expected to be away during the whole period of the enumeration, information on it was obtained from neighbors. A matching process was used to eliminate duplicate reports for a person who reported for himself while away from his usual residence and who was also reported at his usual residence by someone else.

URBAN AND RURAL RESIDENCE

The reports for the Canal Zone, Guam, and the Virgin Islands include data by urban and rural residence. For the 1970 census, the urban population comprises all persons living in places of 2,500 inhabitants or more.

DISTRICTS AND SUBDIVISIONS

The primary divisions of these areas are administrative or judicial districts, or islands. For the purpose of this report, certain of these divisions are further subdivided into areas termed countries in American Samoa, quarters in the Virgin Islands, and municipalities or islands in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. The various geographic divisions are identified in Tables 2 and 3.

PLACES

Data for places are presented in Table 4. Places recognized in this report are generally closely settled centers of population without corporate limits. Places are reported separately where their boundaries are known locally or could be reasonably defined for census purposes. In a few instances, however, the limits of a place were defined arbitrarily.

In American Samoa, places are designated as villages; in the Canal Zone, as towns; in Guam, as cities or villages; in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, as municipalities, towns, or islands; and in the Virgin Islands, as cities.

**Summary of Statistics on Business and Employment for
First Quarter EX 1973**

The figures presented here in tabular form represent an employment profile for private industries and governmental agencies in Guam, FY '73. Data for private firms were obtained from reports made to the Department of Labor during the months of June, July, August, and September as part of the business license clearance procedure. Two thousand twenty-one (2021) firms from the private sector made reports which were checked against an establishment survey and telephone follow-ups. Government agencies, also, submitted monthly employment reports.

Some significant changes in this year's report on employment and business are noteworthy. Employment in the construction industry continues to grow rapidly. The participation of the local labor force — U.S. citizens and permanent resident aliens appears to be less. However, this figure does not reflect the changes in administrative policy, including strict enforcement of the 10% U.S. resident requirement, or the increase in wage rates. On the whole, the increase of 30.4% construction workers for FY '73 is in line with the 31.0% increase in construction projects according to Building Permit Division, Dept. of Public Works, Government of Guam. The Finance, Insurance, and Real Estate Industry has the highest rate of decrease of paid employees at 16.2%; although self-employed agents in this field has increased.

The number of U.S. citizens employed is up 11% from FY '72, while the number of non-immigrant aliens employed has increased by 22.7% for the same period. The number of the local labor force employed has increased by 10.4%. In summary, the total number of nine hundred fifty-five (955) firms with paid employees has increased by 19.7%, thus enhancing the total number of paid employees by 13.1%.

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS

Statistical information compiled by the Department of Agriculture is gathered from various sources. Production statistics are basically derived from reports of the Extension Service Division and from volunteer information given by local farmers. Marketing data, particularly on fruits and vegetables, are obtained from retail stores, roadside stands, hotels, restaurants, the Farmers' Market, and the military. The Economic Research Center of the Guam Department of Commerce supplies the statistics on agricultural imports.

Estimates on local fruit and vegetable production are largely based on the acreage and number of bearing trees harvested. These estimates are partly cross-checked by comparing them with the quantities or volume of produce delivered to various market and consumption outlets. The Consumer and Marketing Service Division conducts weekly spot-checks of small stores to arrive at an estimate of the quantities marketed. In the case of bigger outlets, including the military, appropriate forms are being issued to these entities to record their purchases of local produce. The information is collected monthly.

Poultry and livestock figures, on the other hand, represent only population estimates taken usually at the end of a fiscal period. Fish catch data are collected monthly by the Fish and Wildlife Division through fishermen interviews and through the reports of fish weir operators.
